The Future Planning Center (FPC) is here to help you determine the steps necessary to meet your goals. We encourage you to utilize the FPC during their study halls to research colleges, majors, careers, work on applications, essays, etc. Students who would like to visit the FPC during their study hall just need to get a pass from one of the College Career Coordinators prior to their scheduled study hall. Students can get a pass before school or in between periods.

Do you have a lot of questions or want to discuss something one on one with your College Career Coordinator? You should schedule a one on one appointment to meet with your College Career Coordinator.

The College Career Coordinators are available in the FPC for students before school, during school, and after school each day. Please keep in mind that there will be some days the FPC is unavailable due to testing, presentations, and other school events.
