

## Internet source



1. Author's last name, (comma) first name. (period) → **if given**  
\*\* Look 2 places for this, after the title of the article or at the end of the article. If you can't find it, skip to step 2.\*\*
2. "Title of Article or Heading." (in quotation marks) (period)
3. Title of Web site as given on home page. (underlined) (period)  
\*\* Hint... Website title words stand out w/ color/picture near top of page.\*\*
4. Producer/sponsor of site. (period) → **write n.p. if not given**  
\*\*Hint...scroll down to bottom of page. Sponsor is near copyright date.\*\*
5. Date of publication. (period) → **write n.d. if not given**  
\*\*Hint...scroll down to bottom of page. Year is near copyright symbol.\*\*
6. Medium of Publication. (period)  
\*\*Hint... write Web.\*\*
7. Accessed write the date you accessed it. (period) \*Format = Day Month Year.
8. URL. <in angle brackets> (period)  
\*\*Hint...the URL is the web address.  
\*\*You are only required to include the first main portion of the web address.  
This would be up to and including .com .org .gov and so on. \*\*
