


## Fiction

What happened at the end?



What happens to that character in the story?
7. What is the problem in this story?  
How does the problem get solved?
8. Is the writer trying to send a message or teach a lesson with this story? If so, what is the message or lesson?

2. Tell me some facts you learned from this book.
3. What is a question you still have about this topic?
4. What did the author want people to know about this topic?
5. Show me some interesting pictures, charts or maps in the book. Why did the author choose to put that in the book?
6. Find a picture or chart that has a caption. Why is it important to read captions?
7. Does this book have a table of contents?  
Does it have an index?  
Does it have a glossary?
