



 A platypus is the world's most unusual animal!


 These are egg-laying mammals ... which are unmistakable out of water!

- The size of a platypus may be different because of location.





■ Platypus have webbed feet to help them swim.




The platypus uses its tail for quick diving and as a stabilizer.






## California King Snake
