 - Most of the discussion centered around Mr. Dehnert's suggestion that if the proposed second teams for the Middle School and the bowling team do not get approved for 2018-19 due to budget constraints, how much could we raise the activity fee to cover a substantial part of the cost for these new teams (approximately \$77k)
