### IV. NEW BUSINESS

### A. Curriculum

- 1. Music Department information Ms. Kris Jennings Power Point shared, with discussion and thanks to the entire department. The power point presentation is attached to the minutes.
- Agenda item: TLS contract for Modernizing Learning training for grades 7-12 and Induction training, not to exceed \$165,000; received permission to put it on the May Board agenda for approval.
- ELA Update Mrs. Gardy's updates were provided by Mrs. Bast as Mrs. Gardy is at the Federal programs conference; this month. Until the end of the year, she (and all of C&I) will be working on assessments and meeting with curriculum facilitators and other teacher leaders to plan/reflect/implement.
- 4. Math Update Mrs. Rochlin provided the following updates. She and Gigi have been covering HS math classes to allow Algebra II teachers to peer observe one another; this is going well and teachers are picking up new skills and they are looking to continue this practice next year. Continuing with Earn and Learn also going well and additional requests are being made for topics in the future.
- B. Technology Mr. Catalano shared the following updates
- 1. Summer refresh He has a plan in place for all budgeted items to be refreshed this coming year. He is putting those items out for quotes which he plans to bring for approval shortly. Part 3 of the Smart Panel project is on for approval this month.
- 2. A presentation of the phone system options was provided to the committee. Four options were reviewed by Mr. Catalano in detail and a final decision was made based on the best system for the district. The new phone system is on the agenda for approval this month.

- 3. Cohort V Mr. Catalano shared that there have been intermittent issues with some of the Cohort V machines, Lenovo and Intel determined it was a network card issue, they delivered and installed 416 new network cards. All machines are functioning 100% now. While it is great this was done, it took a long time to get to this solution.
- 4. ML update ML meetings continue to happen. Policy 815 is on for first reading. Room 103 is done and prepared to be the hub of ML at the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade center. 700 Machines for 9<sup>th</sup> Grade are here. Teacher devices go out soon and there will be training sessions for the teachers regarding the device. Webpage is coming along. Two rooms for 10-12 have been identified for the ML Hub and are the team is already preparing for next year's deployment.



  - Courses taught include: Music Theory I and II, Music Fundamentals, AP Music, Autistic Support, Marching Band major, Symphonic Band major and minor, Chorus minor, Vocal Ensemble minor, and Orchestra minor. All three branches also have a number of select co-curricular performance ensembles.


