The practice is not supported by legal grounds and presents a huge level of liability and exposure for the school district. The only items and practice that can be promoted without the presence of a school nurse (by a staff member or parent volunteer): • The use of soap/water • Band-aides and ice in addition to rest and sitting out of the activity if feeling ill. • The student or a staff member may contact a parent or guardian (who can bring items for their child, if needed), sitting out until they feel better and/or call EMS, if needed for emergencies Personal use of inhalers or epi-pens (as prescribed by your family physician) is still permissible.
