FULL SLATE OF COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES PLANNED FOR SPRING-FORD'S 2012 OCT. 12 AND 13 HOMECOMING CELEBRATION

ROYERSFORD — A festive weekend is in store for Spring-Ford Area Senior High School students, families and alumni who attend this year's Homecoming celebration, which begins for the public on Friday, Oct. 12 and continues into Saturday, Oct. 13.

Festivities kick off with the annual Powder Puff football game, in which junior and senior girls compete on the playing field, with junior and senior boys serving as cheerleaders. The game begins at 5 p.m. at Coach McNelly Stadium, which is located behind the Ninth-Grade Center, 400 S. Lewis Road in Royersford. Tickets are \$5 per person and will be available at the gate. All proceeds benefit St. Jude Children's Hospital.

On Saturday, Oct. 13, the fun begins at noon with a parade in Royersford. The parade will begin at Seventh Avenue and Washington Street, where the procession will march down Seventh Avenue to Main Street. The parade will turn left on Main and continue to Fifth Avenue and then turn left onto Green Street. From Green Street, the parade will end behind Coach McNelly Stadium.

The parade will feature the talents of Spring-Ford High School's championship Golden Ram Marching Band, the chorus and the Spring-Ford Middle School Band, and will include participation by various high school clubs. Athletic team members, school board members, local dignitaries, local fire companies and the Rowdy Ram will all make appearances.

The football game versus Methacton will begin around 2 p.m., but gates will open at 12:30 p.m. for pre-game festivities, which includes musical performances, as well as the introduction of the homecoming court. At half time, Spring-Ford's homecoming queen will be announced.
