Skyward Update

The Skyward system involves access for parents and students to attendance, assignments, grades, and food service information. Be sure to update all information in Skyward so that you can continue to access and receive information for your child.

It is extremely important that you make any changes to your information as it occurs. We rely on the information in Skyward provided by you in case of any emergency.

First Day Verification

This process was even more complicated this year as the added safety procedures that must be in place when we return to the building and the balance of hybrid groups based on transportation needed to be considered. For these many reasons, changes in student class assignments will not be able to be honored at this time.

Don't Miss the Bus: Bus Status App

Wondering if your child's bus is running late? Download the new Bus Status App for iOS and Android to receive bus notifications straight to your phone!

The Bus Status app displays up to date bus information for schools and school districts. The app sends out push notifications for cancelled, delayed, or early buses, keeping parents and students updated throughout the day. Select your bus route as a favorite to receive notifications for special announcements and late bus information.

Q: Does Bus Status App track my child's bus?

A: No, Bus Status App does not have GPS tracking.

Q: Does Bus Status App keep private information like my address or name?

A: No, Bus Status App does not hold any private information. It does not hold names, street addresses or bus routes. The app simply pushes notifications based on the information you've requested.

Q: When will I see my child's bus?

A: Bus schedules will be uploaded to Bus Status App after August 16, 2022.

Food Service Update: SFASD Breakfast & Lunch for 2022-2023

COST OF BREAKFAST AND LUNCH: The federal government has not extended waivers that allowed all children to receive free school meals, meaning that SFASD will return to pre-pandemic practices for the 2022-2023 school year. This year, families who qualify are encouraged to participate in the Free or Reduced Priced Meals program to help offset the cost of daily breakfast and/or lunch. Families around the country have felt the impact in financial security due to the unprecedented disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSALS

Please do your best to ensure consistency with your child's mode of transportation each day. The consistency in schedule helps to ensure safety to and from school and minimizes confusion for both student and teacher.

Traffic can become congested in the morning, so we ask that you please consider having your child ride the bus if bus transportation is offered in your area. Students that ride the bus will follow all mask mandates and social distancing protocols.

Please be patient and cautious in the morning during parent drop off if you plan on driving your child to school. Our doors open at 8:45 am where students enter through the front main entrance on 4th avenue and can go right to their homeroom.

Students Grade 1-4 9:00 AM- 3:40 PM

Parent Drop off: AM student arrival

- Front doors open at 8:45 AM for all students (4th Street Entrance)
- All students must enter through the front main entrance doors.
- Students report directly to their classrooms
Parents are NOT permitted to park in traffic circle – please pull all the way around the circle for drop off, to enable maximum number of cars in circle and continuous flow of traffic.
- Children must exit passenger side of the vehicle
- Vehicles may never be left unattended in traffic circle

Please note: Doors will remain open and supervised from 8:45 AM to 9:00AM. If your child is not in homeroom and seated by 9:00 AM, the child must be accompanied into school by a parent and will be considered tardy.

Students may not be on school property prior to 8:45 AM, including the playground without parental supervision, as there is no staff on duty.

Parent Pick-up: PM student dismissal

- Dismissal for parent pick-up students begins at 3:40 PM
- All students are to be picked up promptly at 3:40 pm
- Parent pick-up students will be housed and supervised in the cafeteria
- Parents must park their car in a legal parking spot on either Fourth or Fifth Avenue Parents are not permitted to park in the traffic circle at any time during dismissal – this is not a legal parking spot
- Parents must report to exterior cafeteria door on side of building with their ID to sign their child out of school.
- Students will only be released to people listed on student dismissal form

Please note: Parents picking up their child at dismissal must access the exterior cafeteria door off the Fifth Avenue staff parking lot. The Fifth Avenue staff parking lot will not be accessible for use, as this lot is for staff only.

Walkers: Arrival and Dismissal

- Arrival - Doors open at 8:45 AM
- Arrival - All walkers must enter through the front main entrance upon arrival to school and report to their classroom
- Dismissal - All 4th Ave walkers will report to main lobby at dismissal when announced
- Dismissal - All 5th Ave walkers will report to the back stairwell when announced
- Dismissal - All walkers will be escorted and dismissed by staff to the corner of Fourth Ave. and Spring St. OR to the 5th Avenue side of the building (top of school steps).



Bus: Arrival and Dismissal

- All bus students report directly to homeroom upon entrance to building at 8:45am
- Bus students will utilize the Fifth Avenue entrance/exit doors for both arrival and dismissal

AM Kindergarten Students ONLY ---9:00 AM – 11:40 AM

Parent Drop Off – Student Arrival:

- Front Main Entrance Doors open at 8:45 AM (4th Street Entrance)
- AM Kindergarten Students must enter through the main lobby
- AM Kindergarten Students report directly to their classrooms
- Staff is on duty to escort students to their classroom
- Parents are NOT permitted to park in traffic circle during AM Arrival – please pull all the way around the circle for drop off, to enable maximum number of cars in circle and continuous flow of traffic.
- Children must exit passenger side of vehicle
- Vehicles may never be left unattended in traffic circle

Please note: Doors will remain open and supervised from 8:45 AM to 9:00 AM. If your child is not in homeroom and seated by 9:00 AM, the child must be accompanied into school by a parent and will be considered tardy.

AM Kindergarten Students may not be on school property prior to 8:45 AM, including the playground without parental supervision, as there is no staff on duty.

Parent Pick Up – Student Dismissal:

- Dismissal for AM Kindergarten parent pick-up begins at 11:40 AM
- AM Kindergarten students are to be picked up no later than 11:45 AM from Front Main Entrance
- AM Kindergarten Parents can use the traffic circle to pick up their kindergarten child from the AM session
- Parents must report to main entrance doors with their ID, to physically sign their child out of school upon approval from a staff member on duty
- Students will only be released to people listed on student dismissal form

Bus: Arrival and Dismissal

- All bus students report directly to homeroom upon entrance to building
- Bus students will utilize the Fifth Avenue entrance/exit doors for both arrival and dismissal

PM Kindergarten Students ONLY ---1:00 PM- 3:40 PM

Parent Drop off –Student Arrival:

- Front Main Entrance Door opens at 12:45 for PM Kindergarten Students
- PM Kindergarten students must enter through the Front Main Entrance (4th Street)
- Staff will be on duty to escort PM Kindergarten students to classroom
- PM Kindergarten Parents can use the traffic circle from 12:45 PM-12:55 PM to drop off their kindergarten child for the PM session.

Students MUST remain with a parent until a staff member opens the door. As a safety precaution, please do not allow your child to play tag or run with other students while waiting for doors to open.

Please note: If your child is not here by 1:00 PM for the PM Kindergarten session, the child must be accompanied into school, utilizing the front main entrance door, by a parent, and will be considered tardy.

PM Kindergarten students may not be on school property prior to 12:45 PM, including the playground, without parental supervision as there is no staff on duty.

Parent Pick-up Student Dismissal:

- Dismissal for PM Kindergarten begins at 3:40 PM
- All students must be picked up promptly at 3:40 pm
- Parent pick-up students will be housed and supervised in the cafeteria
- Parents picking up their child at dismissal will be required to sign their child out of school
- Parents must park their car in a legal parking spot on either Fourth or Fifth Avenue
- Parents are not permitted to park in the traffic circle at any time during dismissal – this is not a legal parking spot
- Parents must report to exterior cafeteria door on side of building with their ID, to physically sign their child out of school upon approval from staff member on duty
- Students will only be released to people listed on student dismissal form (attached)

TO AND FROM SCHOOL



Walkers + Crossing Guards

If your child walks to school unescorted by a parent or another adult, please be certain to emphasize that they practice safety when crossing streets and walkways. Walkers will be dismissed through our Front Main Entrance. Students will only be escorted to 4th Street at the end of our school driveway or to the top steps on the 5th street side of our school.

Since many of our students walk to and from school, adult crossing guards, employed by the Borough of Royersford, are posted at key intersections within the borough. Work with your child to establish the safest and most direct route to and from school. Also, please encourage your child to listen to and respect the crossing guards.

Fourth grade student safety patrol members are assigned to our buses, to provide another set of eyes and ears for the driver.

Spring Street Traffic Circle

The circle around the flagpole on Spring Street at the front of the building is intended for use by parents in cars who are dropping off or picking up students.

In the morning at arrival time there is absolutely no parking in the traffic circle. When you arrive in the circle, please pull around as far as you can go to leave room for cars entering behind you. When your child has exited your vehicle, please exit the traffic circle immediately to keep the flow of traffic moving. You may NOT park or leave your vehicle for any reason in the morning.

ALWAYS ENSURE THAT YOUR CHILD EXITS THE VEHICLE ON THE PASSENGER SIDE OF THE CAR WHEN UTILIZING THE TRAFFIC CIRCLE FOR DROP-OFF.

Bicycles



Only students in fourth grade are permitted to ride bicycles to school. However, permission must be obtained from the building principal. Helmets, as required by law, must be worn by all students who ride bicycles to and from school. A bicycle lock is also a must.

It is best for students to walk their bikes on school property at both arrival and dismissal times, as there are many walkers during these times. Students who fail to follow proper bike-riding procedures will have their riding privileges revoked.

Bus Stops

It is recommended that students be at their bus stops five minutes prior to their assigned time on the first few days of school. Please remember that school bus safety begins at the bus stop. It is recommended that an adult accompany students to the bus stop if possible.

The school's main phone number is 610-705-6005. Please save this number in your contact list. This number provides "one stop shopping" for contacting the school as well as the Absentee Phone Line. In addition, by calling this number you can access the voice mail for all school staff. When you phone the school, your call will be answered by the automated system. Listen for options and instructions. If you need the main office, simply press "0". The school's fax number is 610-705-6250.

Volunteer Policy

All volunteers and visitors must be scanned into our Raptor Security System and need to have their license accessible during your visit to school. We recently had upgrades made to Raptor, however we were not able to retain previously scanned drivers' licenses.



The school district provides us a nurse at R.E.S. which is **Mrs. Rachael Schauder**. Mrs. Schauder will carry out state-mandated health services. This includes vision and hearing screenings, height and weight measurements, and emergency first aid. Frequently, parents send sick children or children, who have expressed a physical complaint at home, to the school nurse.


Please be aware that the services that we are equipped to provide only address emergencies or students who become ill while at school. If your child is sick, or if you suspect that your child may be sick, please do not send him/her to school. Instead have your child attended to by a doctor or other health care professional.

All medication that your child must take during the day is to be accompanied by a Medication Request Form (available from the school nurse or on our school's website). School nurses store and administer ALL medicine. This includes over-the-counter medications.

School Wide Theme

Our year-long theme for 2022-2023 is **Learning is our Super Power!**

Student Absences and Adult-Sponsored Trips

If it becomes necessary for you to take your child out of school before dismissal time, you must report to the office and sign your child out using the building's log. No child may be taken from the school premises without following this procedure, and you may be asked to show identification. Please schedule non-emergency doctor, dentist, and other appointments after school hours.

Whenever a child is absent, an excuse card or parent note is required. Please provide the reason for absence as well as the date or dates your child was absent from school before signing the excuse card or note. If an excuse card is not received within three days of a student's absence from school, the absence will become "unlawful".

Current district policy provides for limited absences related to a family trip or vacation. The request form for this type of absence must be completed at least five days prior to the start of the trip. Please consult the elementary handbook for additional information regarding adult-sponsored trips. Trips for 3rd and 4th graders will NOT be approved during PSSA state-wide testing. Keep in mind that after 10 total absences including trips, a doctor note will be required for the absence to be considered excused.

Absence Reporting

Parents should notify the school's attendance office by phone if your student will be absent or tardy from school. This way, both the school and parents can be assured that all students have either arrived safely at school or are absent with parents' knowledge. If you choose to send an email in addition to calling the absentee line, please be sure that it is sent from a Skyward associated parent/guardian email address. Please provide the following information:

- Students Name
- Grade
- Teacher
- A **detailed** reason for the absence/tardy (i.e. if sick, stomach ache or if late, doctor appointment, etc.)

And please remember that our District requires that a written note be sent in to school within three days of your child's return.

Visits to the School During the Day

To preserve instructional time and maximize the safety and security of our students and staff, as well as minimizing disruptions during the school day, we have implemented a "forgotten items" table that is located inside the vestibule of our school. We ask that you label the item with your student's name and teacher, and we will have a 4th grade student deliver the forgotten item(s) around 11:00am. Thank you for your cooperation with this new process.

We do have many opportunities for parents to get involved but we ask that you help us preserve our instructional school day by reducing interruptions. This means ensuring that your child has everything they need before they come to school so that we do not need to disrupt teachers and students during the day. Be sure to call the school office prior to any visit.

Birthday Celebrations

As a reminder the observance of a child's birthday can be celebrated with non-food items (pencils, stickers, book of choice for teacher to read, erasers) due to the number of students with severe allergies and to focus more on making healthy choices. We do not allow whole class food treats for a child's birthday. Exceptions to this rule will only be made for District recognized celebrations such as Valentine's Day, Halloween, and Winter Holidays. Due to the Healthy Choice Initiative, we ask that you do not bring in food from fast food restaurants.

Invitations for parties may not be distributed at school.



Emergency School Closings



Should school have to be closed because of weather conditions or a building-related problem, it will be closed only by official notification from the district superintendent. A recorded announcement will be made via the Skylert System. **Please do not call the school office.**

Please note: If school is delayed for two hours, there will be a revised schedule and doors will open at 10:45 a.m.

There is also a modified schedule for kindergarten in case of a 2-hr. delay:

AM kindergarten will operate from 11:00 a.m. - 12:45 p.m.; and PM kindergarten will operate from 1:55 p.m. - 3:40 p.m. This will enable both sessions of kindergarten to be held on days when there is a two-hour delay. If schools close early there will be no afternoon kindergarten classes.

If schools close early due to weather conditions, it may be necessary to dismiss students early without advance warning. Now is the time for parents to make prior arrangements concerning where their children should go if no one is home. This information should be shared with your child. Parents should make certain that their children understand what they are to do in the event of an early dismissal.

Inclement Weather

As winter weather increases in its intensity, it will be necessary that our students, many of whom are walkers, are dressed properly for the weather. Please be certain to check with your child to make sure that he/she is dressed appropriately for the weather. On almost all days, our students spend some time outside for exercise and recess.

ABOUT THE RES SCHOOL DAY

Six Day Cycle

Special subjects, (Art, Music, Library, Physical Education and Ram QUEST), operate on a six-day rotational schedule instead of a Monday through Friday schedule. This schedule is in place for all grades.

A six-day schedule designates the first day of school as "Day 1." The next day will be "Day 2," and so on, through "Day 6." The rotation will continue for all school days. "Day 1" will always follow "Day 6." Snow days, in-service days, vacation days, etc. will not interrupt the rotation. In this way all classes will receive an equal number of special subject classes.

Clothing Considerations

When considering clothing and how to dress for school, please monitor the weather. Royersford Elementary is air conditioned. An effort is made to be certain that rooms are not so cool as to be uncomfortable for students in shorts. In an effort to be comfortable within the air-conditioned building, students considering wearing shorts to school should wait until the outside temperature is at least 70 degrees.

For safety reasons, sandals, flip-flops, open-toed footwear, open-backed or clog-type shoes/sneakers may not be worn to school. Clothing that distracts from learning, such as tube tops, tank tops and tops

that leave the midriff exposed, as well as clothing with inappropriate slogans or symbols may also not be worn to school. Sneakers or athletic shoes must be worn on our playground. Open-backed or clog-type sneakers are not permitted on the playground.

Field Trips

Educational trips are taken by each grade during the school year. Information regarding each trip will be sent home to parents by classroom teachers. Funding for field trips comes from the Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO). Additional charges to students may be necessary. If you are experiencing financial difficulty and are unable to pay for your child to attend a field trip, please contact your child's teacher or the principal. It is our desire that all students attend to benefit from the field trip experience.



School district guidelines specify the maximum number of chaperones permitted. Unfortunately, this does not permit all parents who wish to serve as a chaperone to serve in this capacity. Keep in mind that field trips are not intended to be family trips but educational experiences.
